

# Station Newsletter

Monday, November 26<sup>th</sup>, to Sunday, December 2<sup>nd</sup>, 2007

(Below is a sampling of incidents that occurred during the week)

## **Possession of Crack Cocaine/Concealed Weapon; Arrest**

**Monday, November 26, 2007; 8:11 a.m.; Alvord Lake, GG Park**

Plainclothes Officers received information from a CRI (Confidential Reliable Informant) regarding a dealer selling "crack" in the Alvord Lake area. After gaining a detailed description the Officers went to the area and located the suspect. They observed him for several minutes noting that he was approaching random people engaging in brief conversations; indicative of a person attempting to sell illegal drugs. The Officers then made contact with the suspect and conducted a "pat search" for weapons. They found and removed a concealed knife from the waist area of the suspect. The suspect was now under arrest and the arrest search recovered a plastic baggie containing crack cocaine. The suspect was then booked.

## **Possession of Marijuana for Sales/Probation Violation; Arrest**

**Monday, November 26, 2007; 10:28 a.m.; 600 Block Stanyan St**

Officers noted a man acting in a suspicious manner along a service road in Golden Gate Park. As the suspect exited the park the Officers stopped him to investigate. They determined that he was on probation and had a search condition. The Officers conducted a search of this person and located several baggies of marijuana packaged for sales. This individual was then booked and his probation violated.

## **Fugitive Recovery Operation**

**Tuesday, November 27, 2007; 3:00-9:00 p.m.; Park District**

Plainclothes and uniformed Officers canvassed the entire district in search of wanted persons that were either on parole (state) or probation (local). Over the course of the operation they managed to arrest 11 individuals for various violations, sending all of them back to jail.

## **Felony Theft Arrest**

**Tuesday, November 27, 2007; 4:40 p.m.; 2675 Geary Blvd**

Store security watched as a guy filled his empty backpack with merchandise then left the store making no attempt to pay for the stuff. They stopped him outside the store and arrested him. He told security that he was going to give a wallet to a friend as a gift and sell the rest of the stuff for drug money. Officers were called and determined that he had done this many times before so he went to jail for this offense.

## **Felony Theft Arrest**

**Tuesday, November 27, 2007; 6:20 p.m.; 2675 Geary Blvd**

This time they caught one of their own. Store security called police to arrest an employee who had been issuing herself gift cards. She did it on four occasions for a total of \$1200 and on top of the gift card for 'purchasing' the cards she got additional gift cards. She then went to other Mervyn's department stores to make her purchases. All of her purchases were captured on video. She went to jail for the felony.

### **Robbery of a Gas Station with a Gun**

**Wednesday, November 28, 2007; 7:30 p.m.; Divisadero and Fell**

Officers responded to the gas Station on a call of a man with a gun. Upon their arrival, they were informed that a robbery had occurred. The suspect, had his face obscured by the hood of his sweatshirt, pointed a black handgun at the cashier and took the lottery money, fleeing north on Divisadero from Fell. The loss was approximately \$500

### **Attempted Robbery on the Street**

**Thursday, November 29, 2007; 7:25 p.m.: Central and Grove**

A man was waiting at the bus stop, when 3 black males approached. One suspect grabbed him by the shirt and shoved him against the wall. The victim was able to break free and run. The suspects followed but stopped when the victim called for the residents to call for help. Officers searched the area with negative results.

### **Hot Prowl Burglary**

**Friday, November 30, 2007 0100am 900Blk. Corbett Av.**

A man living in an apartment building that was having some roof work done, woke up this morning to find that during the night, a suspect(s) got into his apartment by a bathroom sky light that was not secure, as it was part of the roof work. The suspect(s) took only a 37" flat screen TV, while he was sleeping. Police were called, and the case is under investigation.

### **Graffiti Malicious Mischief**

**Friday, November 30, 2007. 10:50pm 1600blk. Haight Street**

Four males from "Oroville" drove down to San Francisco to pull up on Haight Street and without permission, start to spray paint a building. The owner comes out and asks the four boys if the 4 door blue Kia is their car, and they said yes! The owner writes down the license plate, and the boys become verbally aggressive toward the owner. ### **Robbery Suspicious Occurrence**

**Saturday, December 1, 2007 1500Hrs. Twin Peaks @ Carmel**

A young man driving a "Safeway" Grocery delivery truck was driving along his route eating some grapes as he drove. He tossed the stem from the grapes out the driver side window. A few seconds later a man in a black Ford Expedition speed past him, pulled in front of him, then stopped. The driver got out and approached the young man with what looked like a police baton in one hand. The man was a white male 6'00 200lbs 30-40 years old. The man waving the baton yelled," San Francisco Police

Officer! Give me the keys to the truck!” The young man complied in fear of being struck with the baton, and gave the keys from the truck. The suspect took the keys and left the scene. The young man was asked if a badge or ID was shown, and they were not. In case you don’t know, we do encourage police complaints. ### **Possession of Marijuana Arrest**

**Sunday, December 2<sup>nd</sup>, 2007 1804 Hrs Haight St/Belvedere**

Two Park Station beat Officers patrolling the upper Haight observed two men sitting on the sidewalk sharing a marijuana cigarette. They were probably consoling each other over today’s ugly 49ers loss to the Carolina Panthers. As the Officers moved closer, one of the guys decided to place the burning marijuana cigarette under his right buttocks. Nice move! This move didn’t slip past the keen eyes of our beat Officers. An arrest was made for misdemeanor possession, and a citation issued.

### **Trespassing, Possession of drug paraphernalia, Warrant arrest**

**Sunday, December 2<sup>nd</sup>, 2007 2037 Hrs 1400 Blk Haight St.**

Uniformed foot patrol Officers from Park Station observed a male trespassing inside the alcove area of a closed business on the 1400 block of Haight St. The business clearly displayed a 25 MPC No Trespassing sign in its window and the Officers advised the subject he was trespassing. A routine warrant check for the subject revealed he had four outstanding warrants for his arrest. Guess what the warrants were for? You guessed it, 25 MPC, No Trespassing. A search incident to arrest revealed this subject was also in possession of illegal drug paraphernalia.

### **Violation of a Court Order / Narcotics Violation**

**Sunday, December 2, 2007; 9:13 pm; Haight & Stanyan Streets**

The beat Officers on Haight Street saw a man that they recognized from prior police contacts. Knowing that he has a “stay-away” order from Haight and Stanyan (for numerous prior drug arrests in that area), he was arrested.
