### **Drunk Resists Arrest**

**Monday, January 16, 2006; 3:57 P.M.; Ashbury Street**

Officers responded to a complaint regarding a man sleeping between two planter boxes. On arrival our Officers found the man out cold in an alcoholic stupor. Initially they had difficulty awakening the man. When he did awake he was very combative slapping at the Officer trying to awake him and kicking that Officer. A slight struggle ensued with the agitated sleeper spitting on the Officer who with the help of another Officer handcuffed the resisting drunk. The alcoholic sleeper was given a bed in county jail until he sees the judge in the morning, whence he can attempt to explain his conduct.

### **Drunk Fugitive Arrested for Impeding Pedestrian Traffic**

**Monday, January 16, 2006; 4:30 P.M.; Haight and Cole Streets.**

Our Beat Officer observed a homeless man passed out on the sidewalk. The man was sprawled out in such a manner that passing pedestrians were having a difficult time stepping around him. The Officer gently awoke the man and on identifying him ran a routine check, which revealed he was a wanted felon with a couple of warrants. Thus he too was given a safe out of the way place to sleep at county jail.

### **Robbery with Force / Aggravated Assault Arrest**

**Monday, January 16, 2006; 8:46 P.M.; Geary and Masonic.**

Officers responded to a reported fight between two females in a department store parking lot. Upon arrival the officers found the store security officer with a lump over her left eye and a bite mark on her right bicep. The security guard had received these injuries while apprehending a shoplifting suspect. The security guard was treated for her injuries at the scene and the shoplifting suspect was booked on a variety of charges.

### **Warrant Arrest**

**Tuesday, January 17, 2006; 1:42 A.M.; 300 Blk of Baker Street.**

Officers responded to a reported fight inside an apartment complex. Upon arrival the officers observed two males entangled in a fight on the sidewalk. The combatants were detained, stating that they were "only wrestling." A computer check revealed two outstanding arrest warrants for one of the individuals resulting in his being booked; the other person was clear and released at the scene. Hopefully these WWF wannabes will leave the wrestling to the pros.

### **Fugitive Arrested**

**Tuesday, January 17, 2006; 2:09 A.M.; Stanyan at Oak Streets.**

Officers responded to a report of a person causing a disturbance in the area of Stanyan and Oak Streets. Finding only one person in the area they stopped to check on the individual. A computer check revealed the person was wanted in another county on drug charges and resisting arrest. He was then taken into custody and had a new reason to moan.

### **Possession of Marijuana for Sale, False ID to a Police Officer**

**Tuesday, January 17, 2006; 9:48 A.M.; Stanyan and Haight Streets**

Officers observed a pedestrian blatantly walk against a red light and stopped him to issue a citation. This individual failed to produce any valid identification and lied about his true identity. Now, with the suspect under arrest, the officers searched his belongings and located several

baggies of marijuana packaged for sale and over twenty hypodermic syringes. Again the simplest violation led to the undoing of a drug seller.

### **Aggravated Assault, Arrest**

**Wednesday, January 18, 2006; 8:35 A.M.; Stanyan and Haight Streets**

Officers observed an altercation in front of Cala Foods. Suddenly an individual approached the two people engaged in the argument and hit one of them causing him to fall back striking his head on the pavement. The victim began bleeding profusely from the head wound and was unconscious. The officers immediately rendered aid, arrested the suspect and summoned medical attention. The victim is recovering at the hospital and the suspect is now residing in jail.

### **Burglary of Store**

**Wednesday, January 18, 2006; 12:35 p.m.; 2675 Geary Blvd.**

A thief enters the Mervyns Department store with an obviously empty backpack. Immediately store security keys on the individual. They watch via closed circuit television as the guy selects miscellaneous clothing totaling over \$200. He then goes into the dressing room with the merchandise and shortly reemerges with only one item of clothing. Now his backpack appears full. Security follows as he exits the store making no attempt to pay for the stolen items. They attempt to stop him outside the store and the guy runs. He doesn't make it very far when store security is able to wrestle him into custody. The police are called and book him for burglary.

### **Felony Warrant Arrest**

**Wednesday, January 18, 2006; 4:09 p.m.; 1500 block Haight Street.**

Officers stopped two individuals that they suspected were involved in a drug transaction. Upon identifying the two it was discovered that one guy had an outstanding felony warrant out of Plumas County. No drugs were ever found, but the one guy will be returned to sender.

### **Felony Warrant Arrest**

**Wednesday, January 18, 2006; 10:55 p.m.; 1700 block Turk Street.**

Officers were in the above area when they recognized an individual, as someone wanted for viciously beating his girlfriend. Officers had been looking for this guy for weeks. They confirmed his identity and took him to the station for booking.

### **Possession of Heroin, Felony and Misdemeanor Warrant Arrests**

**Thursday, January 19, 2006; 4:00 a.m.; Golden Gate Park**

Officers conducted outreach and enforcement in various locations within Golden Gate Park. The Officers found numerous people camped in the wooded areas, sleeping under children's play structures, and around the Rec and Park Buildings. These individuals were cited for the Park Code violations and offered assistance in finding suitable shelter and other services. Three of these individuals had outstanding criminal arrest warrants and one was in possession of heroin. These individuals were booked. This is an on going effort to attempt get social services to those in need and to make Golden Gate Park a safer place for all to enjoy.

### **Battery**

**Thursday, January 19, 2006; 2:45 p.m.; 1683 Haight Street.**

Some dude was taking pictures at Haight and Cole Streets when a white guy, 24-26 years, 6', wearing a black leather jacket, with his "other" colored hair shaved on the sides came up and shoved him two times. Some people on Haight Street can be very sensitive to being photographed and must have taken offense to this photographer.

## **Warrant Arrest**

**Thursday, January 19, 2006; 3:00 p.m.; 500 block Central.**

Officers were called to the above location on the report of a suspicious guy inside a car. When they got there they found our suspect with an open bottle of vodka sitting in the described car. A computer check revealed an outstanding warrant for his arrest. He was taken to the station and booked on the warrant.

## **Methamphetamine Arrest and Narcotics Violation**

**Friday, January 20, 2006; 9:55 AM; Twin Peaks**

During a passing call of Twin Peaks, a Park Station officer noticed someone sleeping in his car and attempted to do a well-being check on the person. The officer had a great deal of difficulty waking the man, who was not immediately responding to knocks on the window. While trying to wake the suspect, the officer noticed a small baggie containing a white powdery substance. The officer recognized the substance as potential narcotics and when the suspect finally woke, he was placed into custody. Also found in the vehicle was a pipe for smoking speed.

## **Warrant Arrest and Narcotics Violation**

**Friday, January 20, 2006; 2:06 P.M.; Haight and Stanyan Street.**

Officers were on routine patrol when they spotted a parolee with whom they decided in the spirit of community policing to have a chat. The parolee acknowledged he was still on active parole but did not know if any warrants for his arrest had been issued. In a spirit of helpfulness the Officers checked for him and found he was presently wanted for a no bail felony warrant for parole violation. The noble parolee immediately surrendered to our Officers and further gave up his personal stash of cocaine powder. ## **Explosive Devices Found**

**Saturday, January 21, 2006; 09:30 AM; Delbrook Ave.**

A man was in the process of cleaning out his father-in-laws house when he found two apparently "live" artillery shells. The father-in-law has been hospitalized for some time with Alzheimer's and could not provide any information about the artillery shells. Officers responded and when they realized the explosive potential of the shells, they immediately contacted the EOD (Explosive Ordinance Disposal) of the SFPD. The EOD officers arrived and carefully removed the shells to their elaborate "safe" box located in the truck. The EOD truck was then escorted to the SF Airport where the devices were harmlessly detonated.

## **Aggravated Assault Arrest**

**Saturday, January 21, 2006; 5:05 PM; Ashbury & Oak**

A family fight turned violent when the niece punched her uncle in the face. The uncle returned the favor and punched the niece twenty times in the face. When the niece was being punched she was able to get to a sharp object and slash her uncle's face up. The Aunt decided to get involved and hit the niece in the back of the head. When the Officer's arrived to investigate they were told three different stories from the family members. A citizen, who wished to remain anonymous, told the officer's that he video taped the incident. Upon reviewing the tape, the evidence showed that all subjects had violated the law and were charged accordingly.

## **Marijuana Sales Arrest**

**Saturday, January 21, 2006, 11:40 P.M.; 1800 block Haight St.**

The drug dealers on Haight Street forgot that we have plainclothes officers working at night. Working in the cover of darkness our plainclothes officers were able to watch a drug sale being

completed under their noses. After arresting the buyer and seller, the buyer admitted purchasing marijuana from the seller. The seller is on felony probation, for guess what. Selling marijuana on Haight St. A judge also issued a stay away order for the seller to stay off Haight St., but it must have slipped the seller's mind.

### **Petty Theft From A Merchant**

Our Officer found the young lady lying on the sidewalk completely unresponsive to his attempts to awake her. Our Officer radioed for an ambulance to respond. On the arrival of the ambulance sleeping beauty emitting a strong odor of alcohol suddenly sprung to life and refused any medical treatment. She was wanted for a drug violation with bail set at \$10,000 and immediately sent to County Jail to continue her snoozing.
