Felony Drug Arrest

Monday, October 2, 2006; 1:58 a.m.; Masonic Avenue and Haight Street

Officers were in the above area when they saw a man urinating on a tree. They stopped to issue a simple citation for the violation. Well, the local resident didn't approve of the officer's attempts at doing their job. As they checked their computer he was verbally abusive towards the officers. Getting no response from the officers he challenged them to fight. The officers realized that the guy's total lack of judgement must have been as a result of his intoxication. They decided to detain him for public intoxication, as it was apparent that he could not care for himself. He made a feeble attempt at resisting but was easily arrested. At the station officers found suspected methamphetamine in his possession. He was booked for felony lack of judgement.

Two blocks away from where the incident occurred, the victim was able to waive down a Park Police Station Officer. A description of the suspect's vehicle was put out immediately and within minutes Officers spotted the car. Officer effected a felony traffic stop on the suspect's car and took him into custody without incident. In the suspect's car was his eleven-year-old daughter, along with the automatic handgun that the victim had seen. The suspect told the officers that he had armed himself because he was shot at several days earlier. A computer check of the suspect revealed that his gun had been stolen in a burglary, and that he was a convicted felon. The suspect was subsequently identified by the victims and then booked for weapons charges and endangering minors.
